#### 6 Assessment methods

#### 1. Participative Activity

This assessment point also covers the process of creating outline, drafting and reviewing a descriptive paragraph.

# 2. Collaborative Project Outcome

As the result of students' participative activity, there is a product that students will submit. For this course, the final product is the place description paragraph.

# 3. Assignment

The students must complete their narrative paragraph dealing with personal experience. This task is assessed individually.

# 4. Examination

Students will individually compose descriptive and expository paragraphs in a series of writing processes. They review the drafts independently or collaboratively before submitting the final draft of the paragraph.
